Notes From The Bench

Hymns as Devotions

As we begin a new year, many of us may start "something" new or different. Specifically, we might start a book of daily devotionals that correspond to each day of the year. Such books are focused on reading the entire Bible in a year, the Psalms, prayers, hope and the like -- and are designed for teens, grandparents, women, men, families, those who are grieving, those in recovery, and those seeking inspiration, for instance. These books can help guide our personal spiritual time and reflection as a daily practice along our faith journeys.

I would like to use this column to offer an additional option for such a daily devotional resource - **hymns**. There are, of course, actual books with this thematic approach. I own two of these which I recommend highly. The One Year Book of Hymns (by Robert Brown and Mark Norton; published by Tyndale) includes a hymn text, a story or reflection about the hymn, and a scripture for each day of the year. Amazing Grace: 366 Inspiring Hymn Stories for Daily Devotions (by Kenneth W. Osbeck; published by Kregel) follows a similar format plus additional scriptural references and a short segment of the tune for each hymn. However, all that is really needed is a **hymnal** in order to utilize hymns as a source for spiritual study and reflection.

One specific way to use hymns as devotions is through *guided meditation*. I describe the following technique that is based on a practice called "Canticum Divinum" by Christopher Cook ("Canticum Divinum," *The American Organist*, July 2019). The essential framework involves selecting a hymn and proceeding through the text using the following pattern:

- -Begin by slowly **reading** the first verse (aloud, if desired and possible)
- -Pause in **silence** to contemplate the text (focus on the words and what they mean to you)
- -Read the next verse
- -Engage in **silent** contemplation
- -Repeat for the remaining verses

[if desired, you can **sing** (or play) the hymn at the conclusion]

Feel free to make variations of your own. For example, you could read and consider just one verse each day, or repeat the entire process with the same hymn multiple days in a row. The approach could be used in church during the gathering music, prelude or hymn introductions. The power of music will help keep the words – and hopefully the sentiment – with you throughout the day and beyond. I encourage you to give this practice a try. Let me know if you would like to borrow a hymnal or if you would appreciate printed hymn text pages. Here's to a fulfilling 2025!
