PASTOR'S CORNER

I just wanted to take a few lines to update the congregation on where we stand with regard to the calling of your new pastor.

At the session meeting held January 8th, the session voted to write to the Presbytery of Redstone to request their permission to elect a "Pastor Nominating Committee." That letter has been written, sent and received by the Presbytery. Our request will be acted on by the Committee On Ministry of the Presbytery when they meet on the first Tuesday of February

When we receive their permission, the Church Nominating Committee will develope and present a list of candidates who have agreed to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee. This Pastor Nominating Committee will then be elected by the congregation at a specially called meeting of the congregation. That congregational meeting should occur in February

Or early March. Once they have been elected the Pastor Nominating Committee will begin the work of filling out the appropriate paper work for the denomination and the search will begin in earnest.

I know the process has been long and not easy. But please be patient and we will get there — all in God's time. (If you have any questions about the process please always feel free to call me or stop by the office and I will do my best to give you an appropriate answer.)

A Glance at English Sacred Choral Music

The British choral music tradition is well-established and well-respected. The choirs of various cathedrals and chapels in England are renowned for their frequent regular services, copious recordings and top-notch performances. Names such as the Monteverdi Choir, the Sixteen, the King's Singers, and the Choir of King's College, Cambridge are world famous. While this tradition spans from the 16th Century with William Byrd and Orlando Gibbons, through the likes of Henry Purcell and George F. Handel, and includes living composers such as Cecilia McDowall and John Rutter, perhaps the high point of this musical genre occurred in the late 1800s and early 1900s. Significant names associated with this period of British choral music include Charles Villiers Stanford, Herbert Howells, William Walton and Benjamin Britten. However, I will take a more detailed look at three composers whose contributions feature prominently in our hymnal – and in Protestant hymnody in general.

The first of these is Hubert Parry. Sir Charles Hubert Hastings Parry (his full name) was born in February of 1848 and died in 1918. There are five hymn tunes by Parry in our hymnal - covering eight different hymns. The most familiar are likely "When Will People Cease Their Fighting" (#401) [RUSTINGTON] and "O Day of Peace" (#450) [JERUSALEM]. The tune JERUSALEM has become a bit of an unofficial English "anthem" - often sung by crowds at sporting events involving England, and featured in the movie Chariots of Fire. In addition, Parry's "I Was Glad" is a famous standard of the choral repertoire.

The next composer is Gustav Holst (1874-1934). Holst may be best known for his orchestral suite The Planets. Interestingly, the majestic theme from the movement for "Jupiter" was also used by Holst for a patriotic hymn entitled, "I Vow to Thee, My Country." This tune, THAXTED, has been used to set a number of hymn texts in a church context. Among these are "O God Beyond All Praising" (#2009 in Sing the Faith) and "Lead On, Eternal Sovereign" (an anthem the choir is working on as I write this column). A more familiar hymn by Holst is his setting of Christina Rossetti's poem "In the Bleak Midwinter" (#36) [CRANHAM]. He also arranged a setting of the 1582 tune PERSONET HODIE which is used with multiple texts, including "On This Day Earth Shall Ring" (#46) and "Down to Earth, as a Dove" (#300).





The individual from this group whose music appears most frequently in our hymnal is Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958). Four standard hymns have original tunes that were actually composed by Vaughan Williams: "At the Name of Jesus" (#148) [KING'S WESTON]; "Come Down, O Love Divine" (#313) [DOWN AMPNEY]; "For All the Saints" (#526) [SINE NOMINE]; and "God Be with You Till We Meet Again" (#540) [RANDOLPH] which is often used as a Benediction response at Trinity. However, Vaughan Williams also arranged a number of highly popular tunes which are English folk songs or centuries-old church songs. One of these is FOREST GREEN, associated with "All Beautiful the March of Days" (#292), "Eternal God, Whose Power Upholds" (#412), "As Those of Old Their First fruits Brought" (#414), and as an alternate tune for "O Little Town of Bethlehem" (#43). Other common examples are LASST UNS ERFREUEN for "All Creatures of Our God and King" (#455) and "From All That Dwell Below the Skies" (#229) and KINGSFOLD for "O Sing a Song of Bethlehem" (#308) and "Today We All Are Called to Be Disciples" (#434). In total, there are eighteen hymns in our hymnal with music attributed to Vaughan Williams. Similar arrangements of "old" English tunes he has set for organ or orchestra include his "Fantasia on GREENSLEEVES" and the "Fantasia on a Theme of Thomas Tallis."

These three composers represent a fraction (though a significant one) of the powerful influence of British choral music on our traditional music for Christian worship.


